Pupil Deprivation Grant - PDG

The PDG is provided to schools and settings for children and young people aged 5 to 15. Use of the grant should focus on the following key areas (as applicable):

- **high-quality learning and teaching, Community Focused Schools, early childhood play, learning and care, high aspirations supported by strong relationships, health and wellbeing, leadership, Curriculum for Wales and qualifications, supporting post-16 progression**

Source of Funding and Planned spend Total = £35,650 PDG

Details of Activities

Provision of a range of in school and consortium wide clubs and activities to support vulnerable disadvantaged pupils. Provision of opportunities for staff to undertake training and exercise leadership activities within school including area leadership, the leadership of initiatives and projects to raise standards etc Provision of opportunities for staff to undertake training Provision of systems to engage families and the community.

These will include:

- Employment of quality Teaching Assistants to specifically support a range of enrichment and support activities for disadvantaged pupils
- Ensuring a reduced ratio of pupils to teacher for Literacy and Numeracy activities for the disadvantaged pupils
- Provision of activities to enable disadvantaged pupils to access additional curricular opportunities such as instrumental tuition
- Provision of School Councillor to support vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils in school
- Engagement of parents in school life including supporting learners,
- Having a range of IT based resources available for supporting parents to help their children learn,
- The development of the Gateway/Schools Comms systems of communication
- Transitional activities and visits with local pre-school providers

- In-school activities to aid transition between classes and across departments. Transitional support to KS3

Early Years Pupil Deprivation Grant - EYPDG

The EYPDG gives similar support to children aged 3 and 4 in schools and nurseries. This includes both maintained and non-maintained settings. This funding is used to support:

- **emotional and social wellbeing, physical development, speech, language and communication**

Source of Funding and Planned spend Total £2,300 PDG

Details of Activities

Provision of a range of in school activities to identify pupils at risk of underachievement, provide quality support, track progress and ensure that practitioners take part in professional development activities to support pupils.

- Provision of activities which will include:
- identifying pupils at risk of underachievement and targeting specific support
- Making effective use of experienced Teaching Assistants.
- Monitoring and evaluating the progress made by pupils undertaking interventions.
- Ensuring that good practice is shared and Professional Development is undertaken.
