Dear Parents and Carers,

Questionnaire

Thank you to all of you who completed the questionnaire. We are always grateful for your feedback as this helps us to plan for further improvements.

By far the outcome was very positive, which is encouraging!

There are a couple of areas which a few parents raised, which as a result we will address.

Parents Evenings and Pupil Progress

Historically, we held termly Parents Evening on one evening, which as you would appreciate, was a very busy and long event for everyone!

In more recent years, we have addressed this by holding it over two evenings and also offering a virtual appointment for those unable to attend in person.

Three comments from the questionnaire noted that the amount of time allocated for each appointment is only 5 minutes. We completely agree that this isn't long enough. In reality, the system allowed for around 7 minutes but we think that 10 minutes is much more realistic and so going forwards, this is what we will offer. You can let us know what you think once we tried it!

It is also important to highlight that teachers are also available by appointment in between Parents Evening if you have a concern about your child or their progress. Often you will be able to catch them for an urgent message on the gate each day. You can also request a phone call but I know that you will appreciate that this will need to take place outside of classroom session times.

If you have a concern and you think your child may have Additional Learning Needs (ALN), you will be able to raise this with the class teacher who will follow the process of referral to our ALNCo (ALN Co coordinator), Mrs Wilcockson.

If it has been agreed that your child has ALN, you will already have lots of opportunities to see the ALNCo as part of your child's review but you can still request a meeting with her on Parents Evening if necessary.

School meals

A couple of parents commented about the quality of food. This continues to be monitored alongside FCC. If you do have a specific concern, please raise this.

General

There were a few parents that used the questionnaire to raise a specific concern about their child. We are not able to identify you and so I would encourage you to speak directly to the class teacher or if appropriate to me if your worry has not already been addressed.
