Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to inform you that your child's class has been selected to participate in the Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) 2026. This letter provides you with information about the study and what's involved.

What is PIRLS?

PIRLS is an international study that takes place every five years and gathers data from over 60 countries, including Wales. PIRLS looks at the reading skills of 9–10-year-olds around the world. The results are used by our government, and governments from around the world, to improve their education systems, so it's vitally important that schools and pupils participate. What is involved?

The study involves reading short passages of fiction and non-fiction and answering questions, as well as a short questionnaire. It will take place on **Thursday 4th June**. Your child doesn't need to do anything to prepare and nor will it affect your child's results or progress in school. If there are any questions they do not wish to answer, they may leave them blank. Please be assured that your child's results will not be identified in any reporting. This is because it is the education system, not your child, that is being reviewed.

Parents/carers will also be asked to complete a home questionnaire online before the PIRLS test date. This will be sent home with your child and information on how to complete it will be enclosed with the questionnaire.

The privacy and data security of the parents/carers, pupils and schools is very important, and no individual or school will be identified or identifiable in any reporting. A full privacy notice, which sets out how the information collected in this study will be used, is available in the 'Data Protection' section of the Pearson website.

We would like to thank you and your child for their participation in PIRLS, your contribution is highly valued. PIRLS Information for Parents/Carers



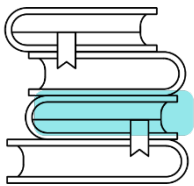
Your child is a member of a Year 5 class which has been selected to take part in the Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) Main Study.



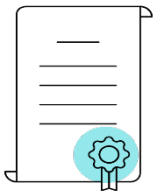
PIRLS is an international educational assessment study which takes place in over 60 countries. Your child will participate alongside other schools from around the world.



PIRLS is a computer-based assessment and questionnaire focusing on the two purposes for reading that account for most of the reading done by young pupils in and out of school: for literary experience, and to acquire and use information.



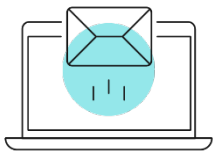
PIRLS can be great reading and comprehension practice. No revision is required, we just ask pupils to try their best and answer what they can.
